

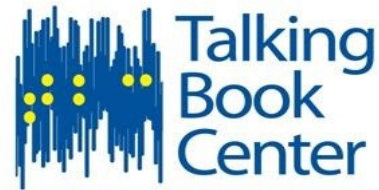
Virtual Resource Showcase for the Blind and Visually Impaired:

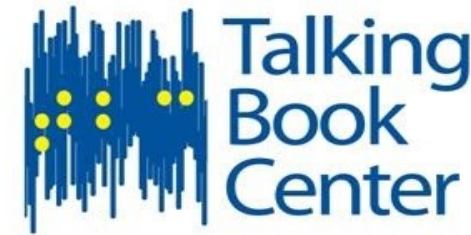

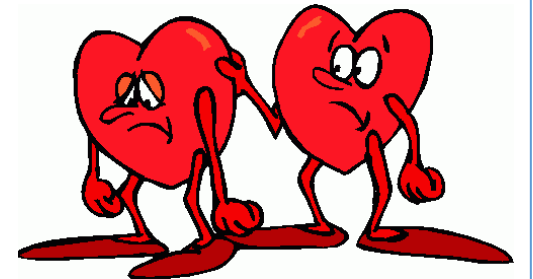

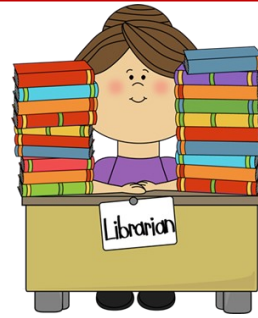
Patron Recommendations:

To save the estates, Eliza comes up with a plan to grow indigo, which she learns to produce from an enslaved person. Some violence. (female narrator)

The Ghosts of Eden Park: The Bootleg King, The Women Who Pursued Him, and The Murder That Shocked Jazz-Age America by Karen Abbott DB96167: The life of German immigrant and lawyer George Remus, who ran one of the largest bootlegging empires during Prohibition. (male and female narrators)

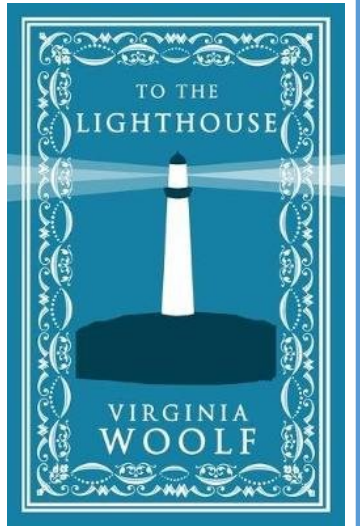
