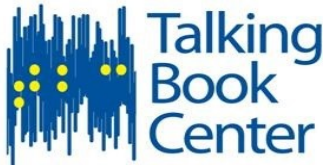

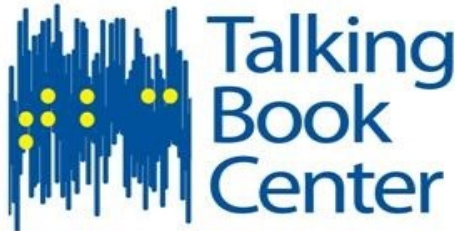

The Third Rainbow Girl: The Long Life of a Double Murder in Appalachia by Emma Copley Eisenberg DB98420: In 1980 in Pocahontas County, West Virginia, twenty-six-year-old Vicki Durian and nineteen-year-old Nancy Santomero were murdered in an isolated clearing while hitchhiking to a festival known as the Rainbow Gathering. Follows the threads of this crime through the complex history of Appalachia. Unrated. 2020.

Lady in the Lake by Laura Lippman DB96116: Baltimore, 1966. Maddie Schwartz leaves her twenty-year marriage and takes a job at the newspaper. She investigates a young African American woman whose body was discovered in a park fountain. No one seems to know or care why she was killed except Maddie--and the victim herself. Unrated. 2019.

Big Burn: Teddy Roosevelt and the Fire That Saved America by Timothy Egan DB69976: Depicts the 1910 forest fire that devastated swaths of Idaho, Washington, and Montana and portrays the people who battled the flames. Highlights President Theodore Roosevelt's and the fledgling U.S. Forest Service's stance against mining and timber interests, which led to efforts to conserve the country's natural resources. Some strong language. 2009.

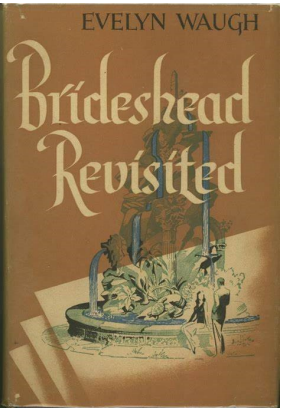

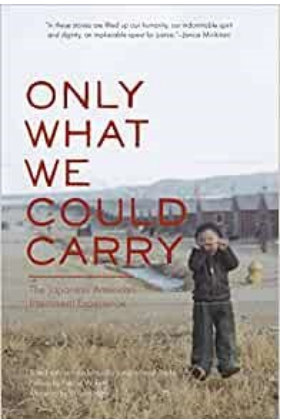

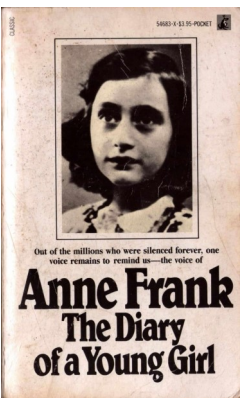
