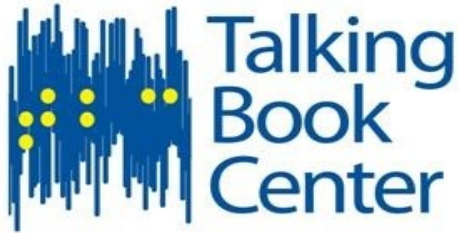
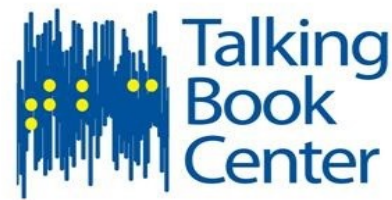


Patron Recommendation:

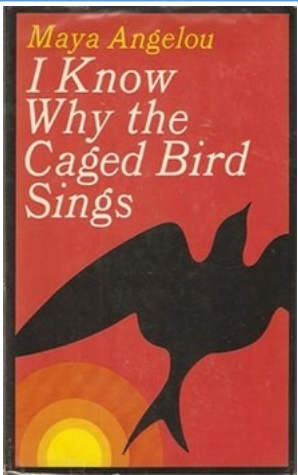

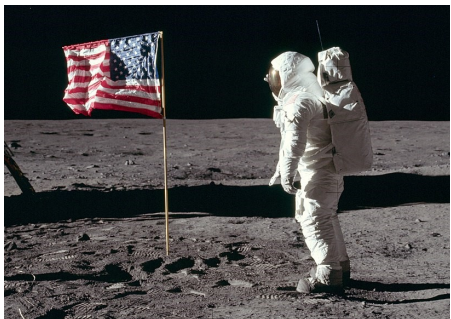
