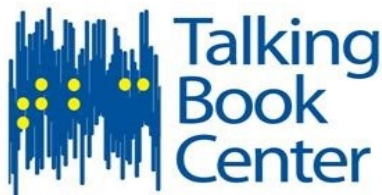

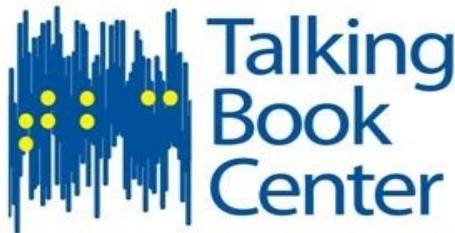

House of Winslow series by Gilbert Morris: A religious fiction series that chronicles the Winslow family, starting in the 1600s and finishing in the 1940s.

Love Is A Gentle Stranger (Lasting Love) series by June Masters Bacher: Religious fiction romance set in the American frontier.

Arnold Morgan series by Patrick Robinson: A modern day naval thriller series.

Revolution At Sea Saga by James L. Nelson: American Revolution era sea adventure.

Brotherhood of War series by W.E.B Griffin: Military fiction ranging from WWII to the Vietnam War era featuring the lives and exploits of the men of the US Army.

Camel Club series by David Baldacci: Political thriller featuring a group of men who try to track down government conspiracies.

Detective Sargent Mulheisen series by Jon A. Jackson: Mystery detective series written between 1977 and 2004.



Grace Livingston Hill wrote several religious fiction and romance books in the early 1900s, and we have 33 of her titles!

Rex Stout, author of the popular Nero Wolfe detective series, has nearly 50 titles written between 1934 and 1975!

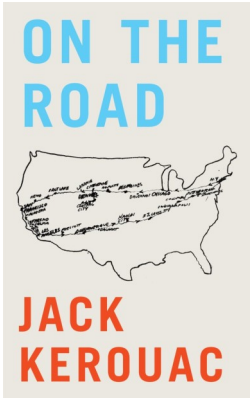
