

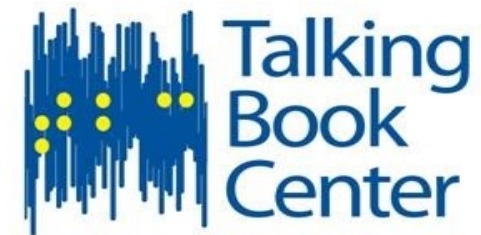
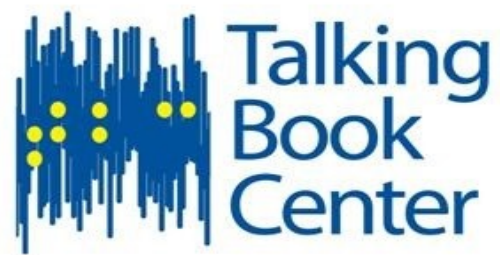

iBill Currency Reader:

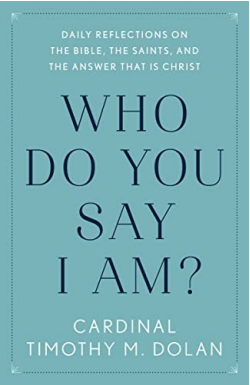
As part of a pilot program for the Bureau of Engraving and Printing (BEP), the Talking Book Center now has iBill Currency Readers in stock for TBC patrons! Instead of filling out paperwork, sending it to Washington, and waiting for 8 weeks... all patrons have to



do is ask for one, and we'll send it out within a day! The device is small, compact, and runs on an AAA battery, which is included. To use the currency reader, simply insert a U.S. paper bill into the reader and press the button. The machine will say “one”, “five”, “ten” or will vibrate short and long dashes. This device is completely free and patrons can keep it! It will arrive by mail, and has instructions in large-print and braille.
