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The Federal Writers' Project (FWP) was a government project in the United States created to provide jobs for out-of-work writers during the Great Depression as part of the Works Progress Administration (WPA). State guides were written and published, detailing the history and unique culture of each state. The WPA also made significant contributions to the preservation of African American culture by conducting interviews and collecting oral histories from freed slaves.

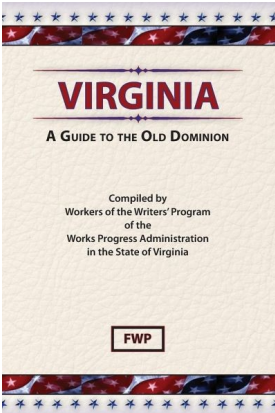
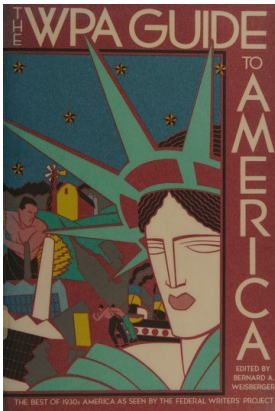
