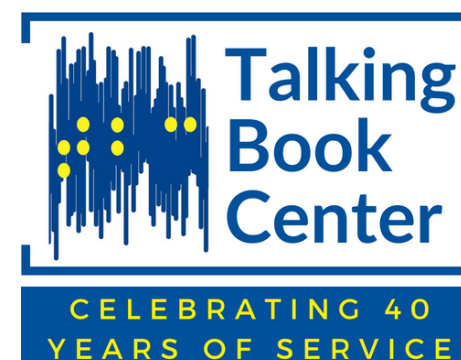

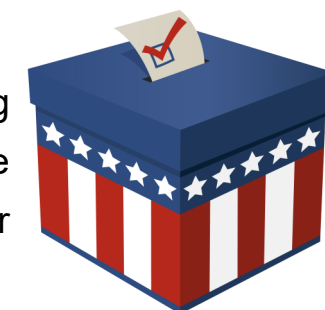

- ♦ Election Day is Tuesday, November 8. All locations will be voting for U.S. House of Representatives and most localities will be voting for school board and city or town council. Contact your local registrar's office for more information.
- ♦ A Veterans Day Ceremony will be held on Friday, November 11 at 10:00 am at the Veterans Memorial on South Main Street in Lexington. Keynote speakers and a variety of presentations will be honoring veterans and their supporters.
- ♦ The annual Senior Health Fair, hosted by the Augusta County Parks and Recreation, will be held on November 16 from 9:00 to noon at the Government Center in Verona. Nobel Prize in Literature 2022 Winner Annie Ernaux:

DB35014 A Woman’s Story
After her mother's death, Ernaux felt compelled to write the older woman's story: that it was her turn "to bring [her mother] into the world." Ernaux describes a strong-willed, ambitious young woman, first growing up in France as a factory worker and later as a married shopkeeper. Their changing mother-daughter relationship illustrates a gradual role reversal as the aging mother slips into senile dementia in her last years.

DB36928 A Man’s Place
In a companion piece to A Woman's Story, Ernaux is once again prompted by a parent's death to create a portrait with words. For most of his life, Ernaux's father owned a small grocery shop in a Normandy town. Like others, he took pains not to act like a farmer or a laborer. He was proud of his daughter's ability in school, sure that she would lead a better life. She, in turn, outgrew him, favoring instead a more cultured life-style.
