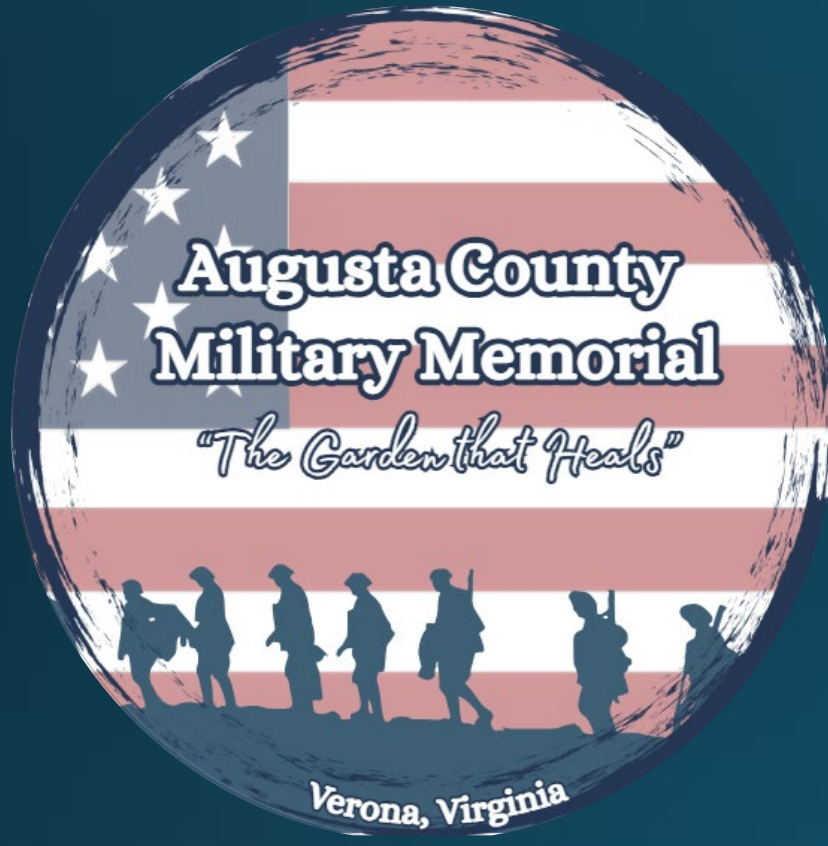

Military.

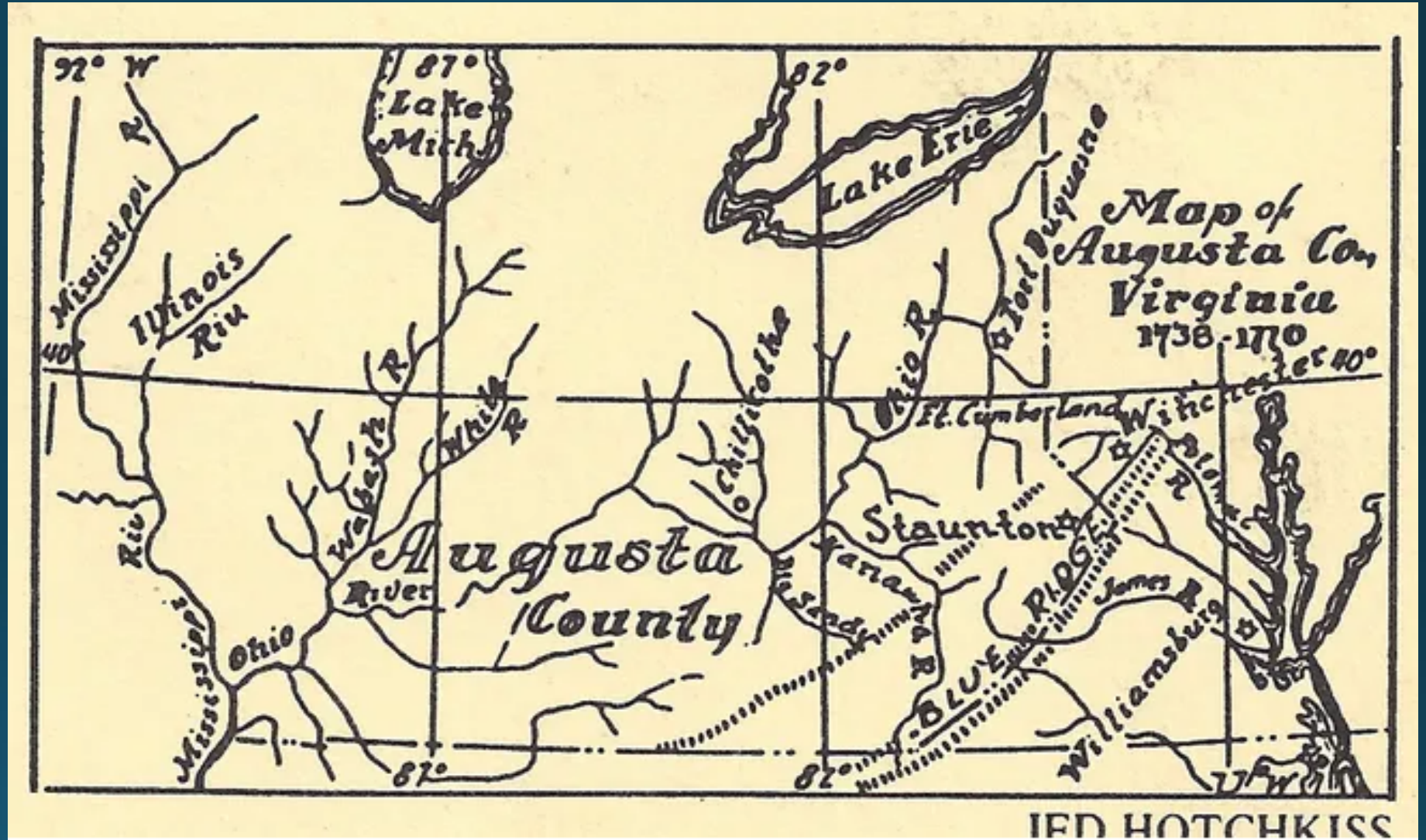
Why do we need a Military memorial?

Nearly 4,000 were killed in action or died because of injuries after they came home.

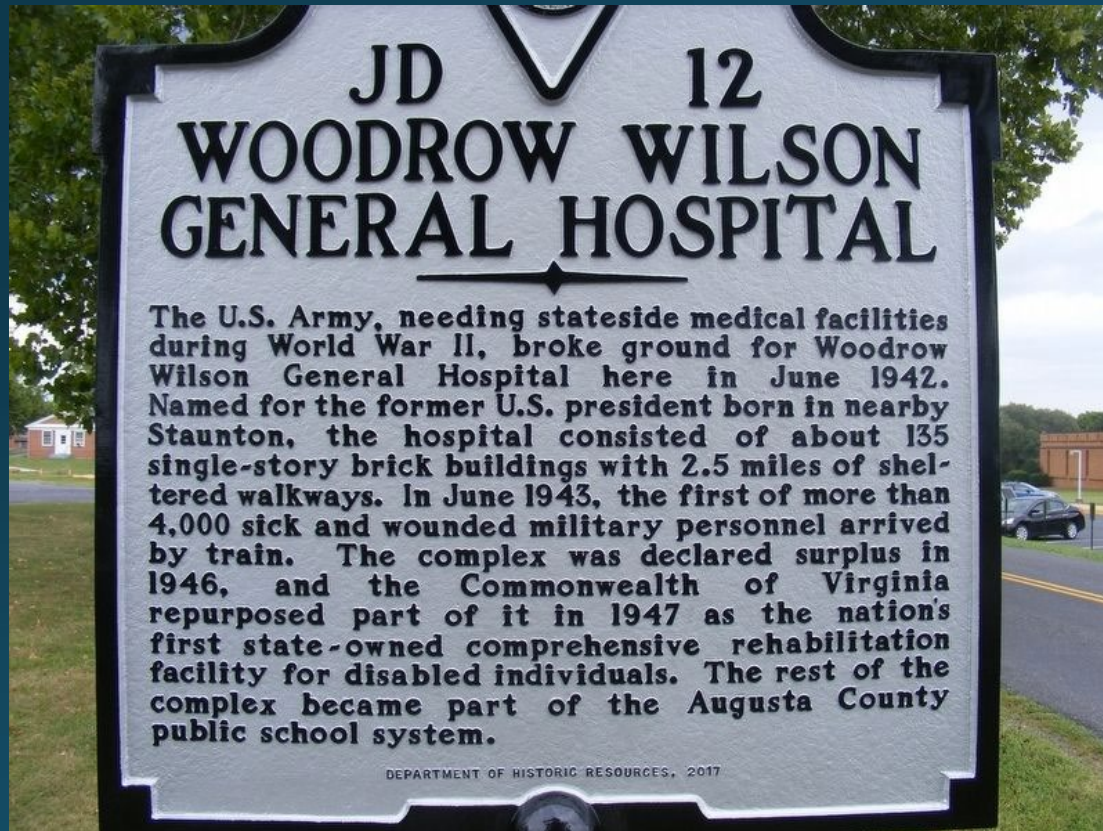
Augusta County has 4,388 veterans living here. (not including Waynesboro and Staunton)

- \$100,000.00

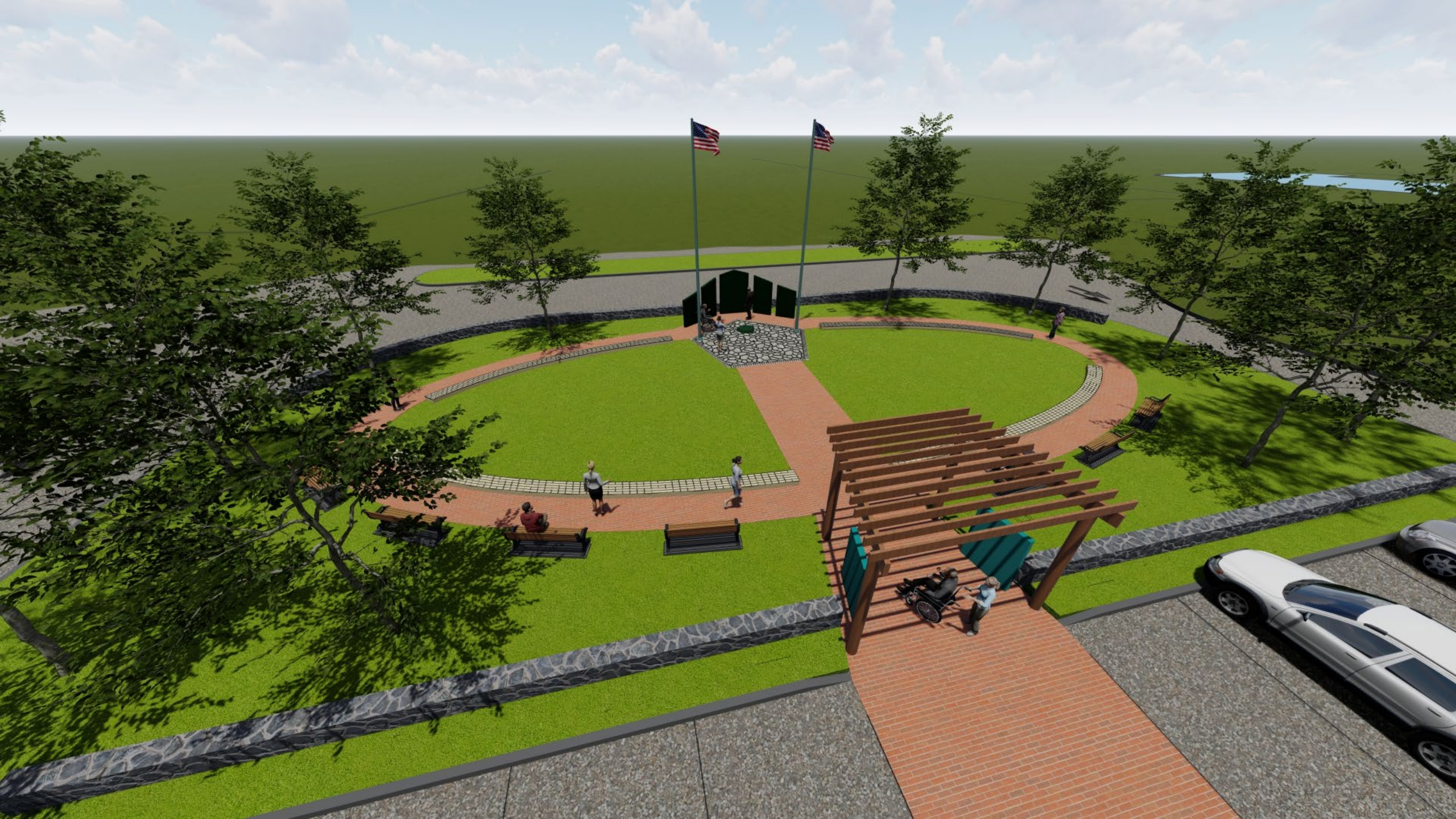
Phases two – four: additional structures

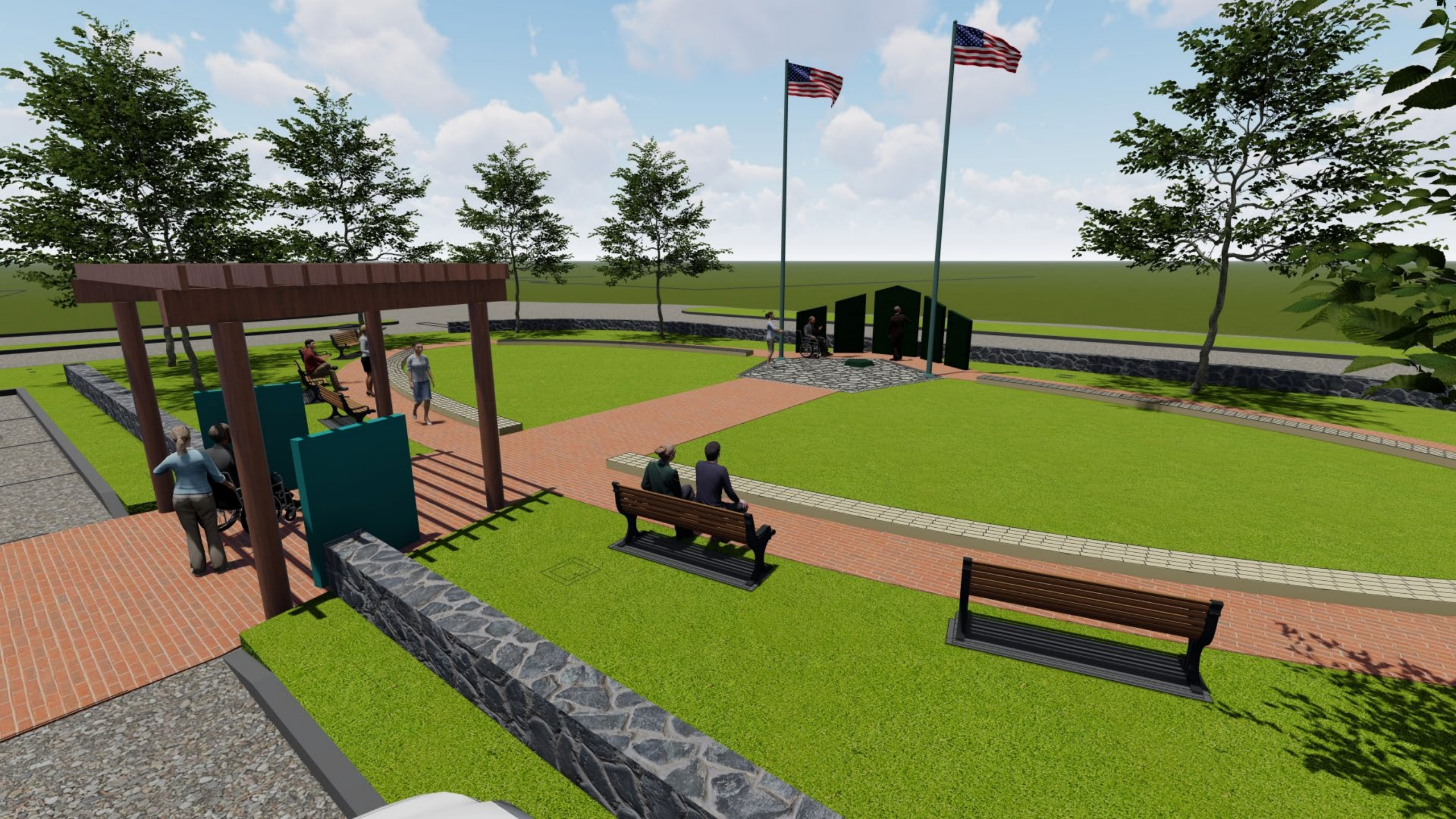
- \$350,000.00 – 400,000.00

+ ongoing maintenance costs

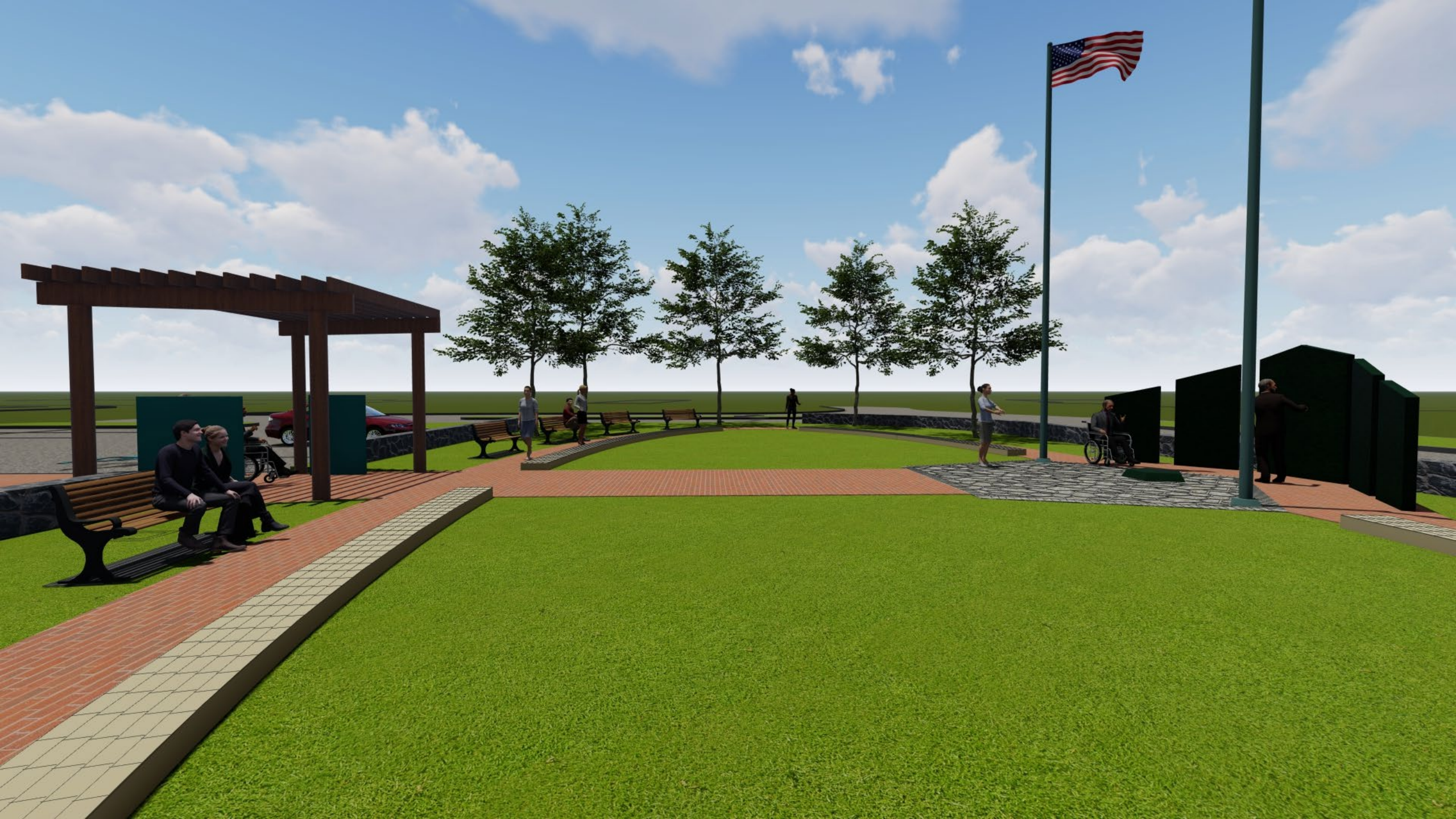
Benefits to the business owner:
