



The **Frontier Culture Museum** in Staunton, Virginia, is a living history museum featuring historic farms from Germany, Northern Ireland, England, Botetourt and Rockingham Counties, Virginia. There is also a West African village and a Native American encampment. Costumed interpreters demonstrate the daily lives and agricultural heritage of the people who settled the Shenandoah Valley.

Pass admits 2 children and 2 adults to the Museum during normal operating hours.

Woodrow Wilson was born in Staunton in 1856 in the former First Presbyterian Manse. This house is now open to the public for tours. The nearby museum tells the story of Wilson's life and the times of suffrage, prohibition and World War I. The planned expansion of the Presidential Library offers valuable resources to scholars.

Pass gives one free admission with the purchase of one admission. Use is limited to one time per year per family.

The **Augusta Military Academy Museum** is located in the 1870s-era Alumni House on the grounds of the now-closed military academy in Fort Defiance, Virginia, eight miles north of Staunton on US Route 11. Founded as Augusta Male Academy in 1874, in 1879 it became the first of seven military preparatory schools in Virginia. The museum portrays the life of cadets and the history of the Academy.

Pass gives 20% discount in Museum shop. Admission to the museum is free. Hours are Tuesday-Sunday, 10 am– 4 pm. Call (540) 248-3007 for more information or visit www.amaalumni.org/Museum



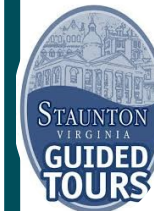
The **P. Buckley Moss Museum** houses the permanent collection of Pat's work, offering a retrospective of her art and life. Collections include religious work, Virginia landmarks and modernistic styles not generally associated with her art.

ABOUT THE MUSEUM PASS PROGRAM

You are invited to sample local museums and attractions by checking out a Museum Pass which will provide free or reduced admission rates. Please note the special terms for each participating venue.

To check out a Pass:

- 1) Choose a museum to visit. Library staff can tell you if the pass is available or you can check in the online catalog.
- 2) Using an Adult library card, check out the pass at the Ground Floor Circulation Desk. Only one pass at a time may be checked out per card. The loan period is 7 days, with no renewal.
- 3) Passes are available on a first come, first served basis. Holds may not be placed on passes. Any Valley Libraries Connection adult card holder may check out a pass, but must do it at the Staunton Public Library.
- 4) Library staff will give you a date due slip that you must take to the museum to receive the special rate. After 7 days the pass expires and will not be honored. You do not need to return the slip to the Library. Most museums collect the slip.

We hope you will enjoy the opportunities these passes offer. Please thank the museums for making them available. Thanks also go to the Friends of the Staunton Library, who have worked to make this possible.



The Blackfriars Playhouse at the American Shakespeare Center is the world's only recreation of William Shakespeare's indoor theatre.

Performances of plays of Shakespeare and his contemporaries are offered year round in repertory. Tours of the Playhouse tell the story of England's first indoor theatre and demonstrate how the staging conditions of 17th-century London shaped the works of Shakespeare.

Pass admits up to four (4) people to a free tour of the Blackfriars Playhouse. Additional tour tickets can be purchased at the normal rate of \$7 each. Tours are scheduled most days Monday–Friday at 11:00 am and 2:00 pm and Saturday at 11:00 am. Patrons should call the box office at 851-1733 in advance to check on the time of the day's tours. Visitors to the American Shakespeare Center will be registered and entered into the ASC files.
