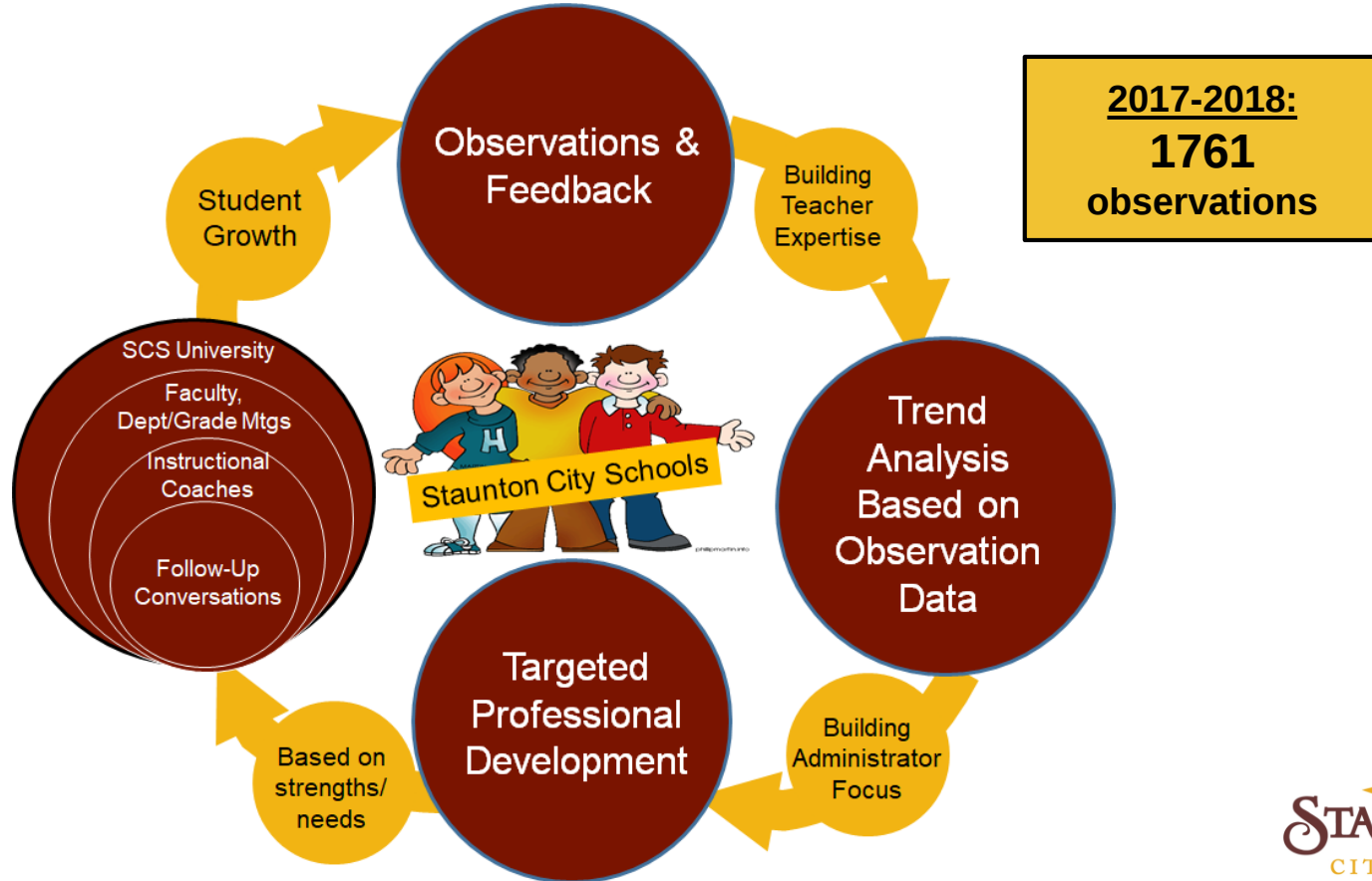

Achievement ~ Bessie Weller

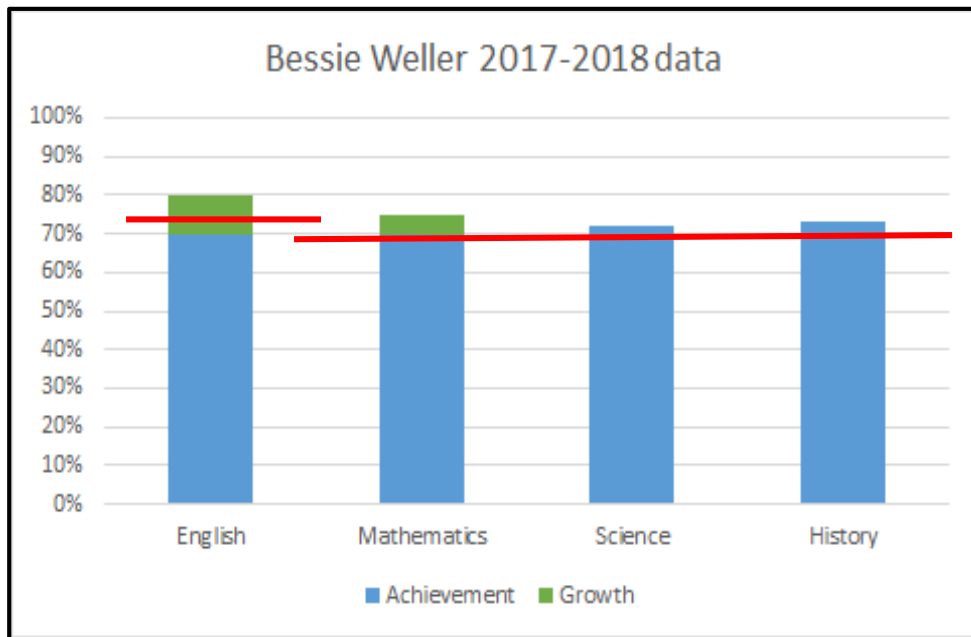


English:

- **15% point pass rate** increase in 5 years
- Combined achievement/growth rate of **80%** - increase of 10% from previous year
- Overall **reading growth is at 10%** -- higher than any other school
- **Increases in ALL reporting groups** –
 - All (+10% to 80%)
 - Black (+20% to 77%)
 - Econ Disadvantaged (+11% to 76%)
 - Hispanic (+2% to 88%)
 - Students with disabilities (+22% to 67%)
 - White (+7% to 82%)

Math:

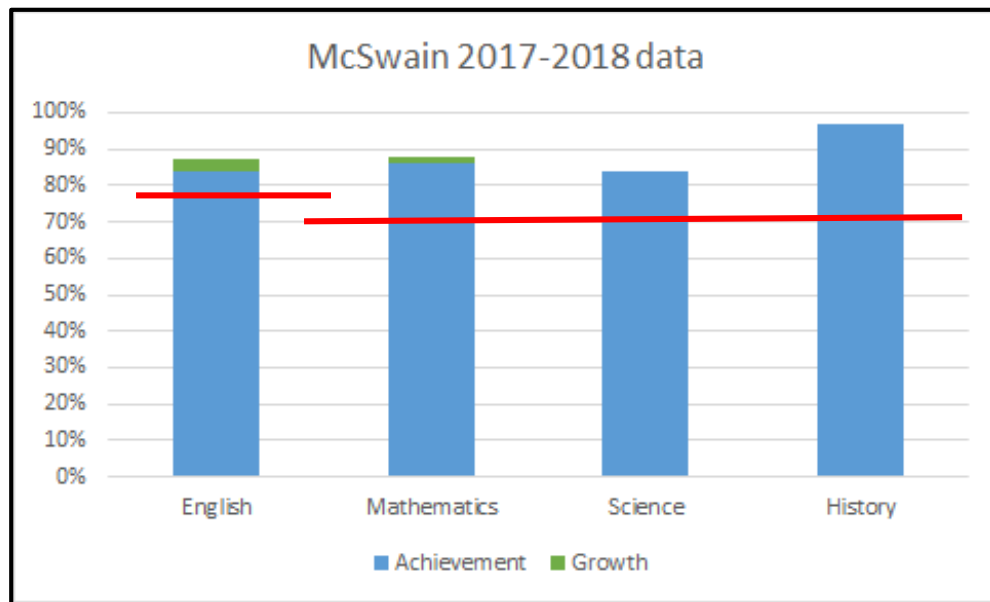
- **Black reporting group** had a 20% increase to 84% and is outperforming every other group



Achievement ~ McSwain



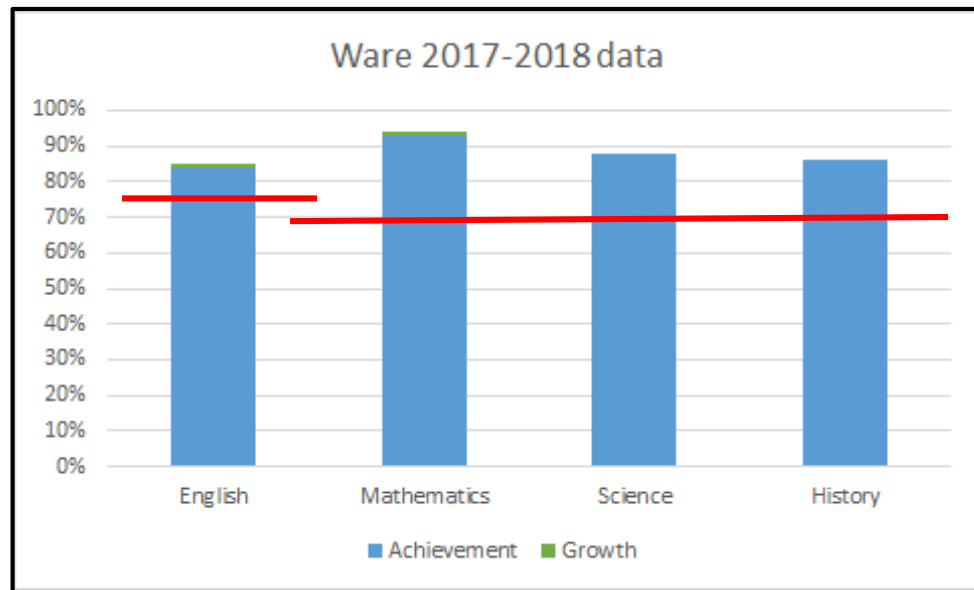
- **Reading:** Exceeded the state average in EVERY grade of Reading: Combined Reading rate of 87%; Black increased by 13% points to 81%; Economically Disadvantaged increased by 6% points to 82%
- **Math:** Exceeded the state average in EVERY grade of Mathematics: Combined Reading rate of 88%; Students with disabilities increased by 17% points to 73%
- **Science:** Exceeded the state average in Science
- **History:** 96% pass rate in Virginia Studies (exceeding the state average by 14% points); 57% of students scored pass advanced



Achievement ~ Ware



- **Met achievement and growth goals in ALL domains of new accreditation matrix**
- **Reading:** Exceeded the state average in Reading: Combined Reading rate of 85%
- **Math:** Exceeded the state average in EVERY grade of Mathematics: Combined Math rate of 94% - 4% increase from previous year (Economically disadvantaged: 92%)
- **Science:** Exceeded state averages in Science
- **Students with disabilities** combined rate: 71% Reading and 84% Math

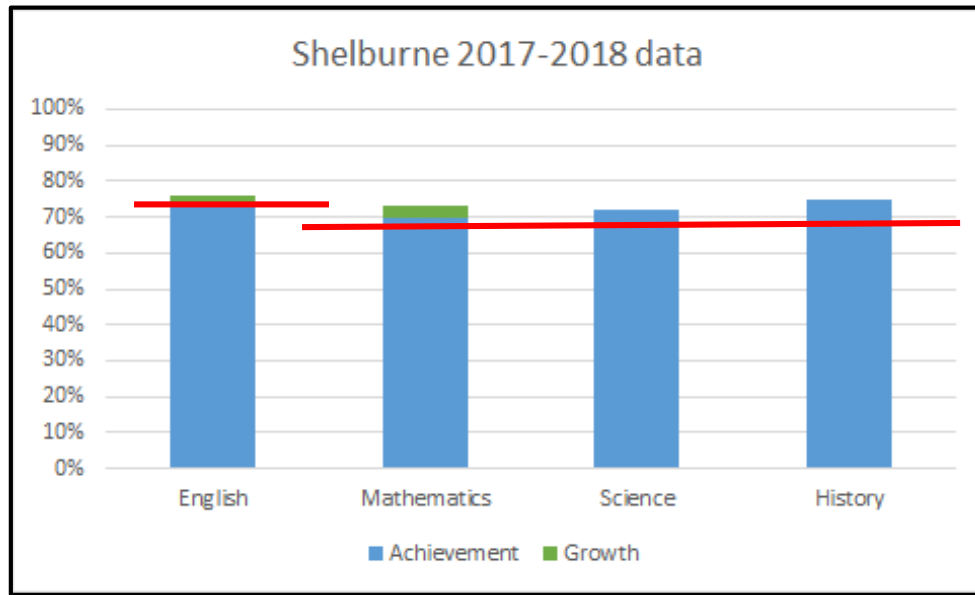


Achievement ~ Shelburne



English:

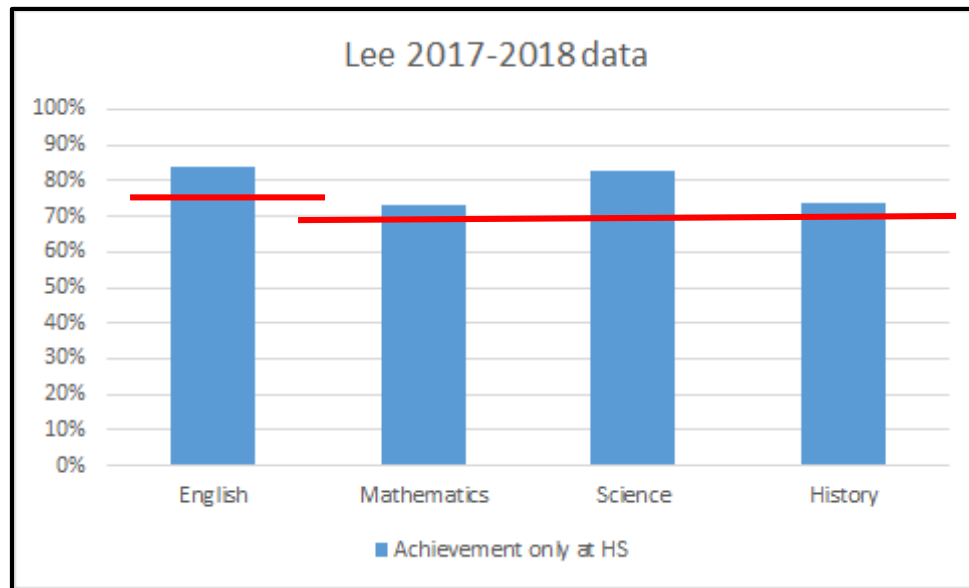
- **Overall pass rate** for English increased by 3% points
- Combined English rate of growth and pass rate is at **76%**; **Black reporting group** increased by 35% points to 70%
- **Math:** 100% performance in Algebra I and Geometry
- **History:** Increased History results by 9% points from the previous year



Achievement ~ Lee



- English overall combined rate is at **84%**
- **Writing** outperforming the state average by 5% points.
- 98% pass rate in **Algebra II**, exceeding the state average by 9%
- 100% of **Grade 9 Algebra** students receiving intervention increased by **1+ growth level**
- 97% pass rate in **Chemistry**, exceeding the state average by 8%

- ◆ LHS Drama Team State Champions
- ◆ LHS Football Regional Champion & State Runner-up
- ◆ LHS Basketball Regional Champion & State Runner-up
- ◆ LHS Boys Soccer wins regional championship
- ◆ LHS Forensics Team wins Super Regional for first time ever and places 3rd in state
- ◆ LHS Scholastic Bowl Team wins Regional Championship and places 3rd in state
- ◆ SCS dominates Regional Math 24 Competition with all 4 semi-finalists; overall winner coming from Bessie Weller

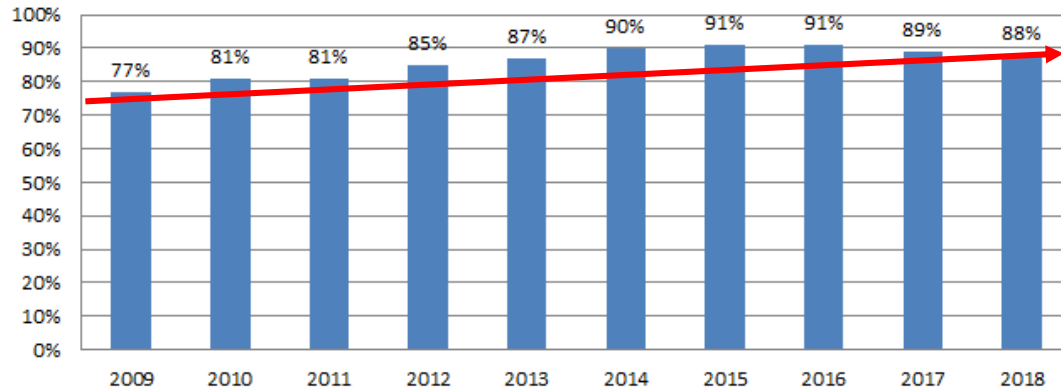

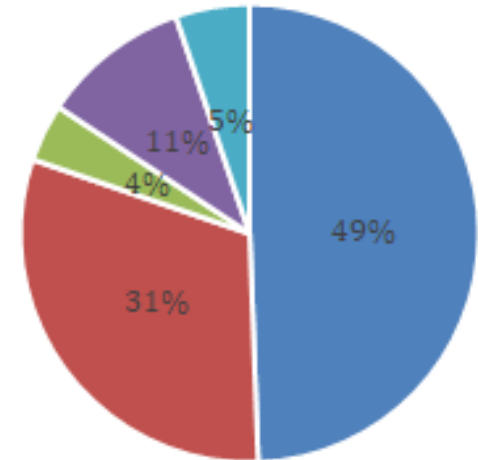

Youth Development ~ 100% Project!

Alternative to Suspension Center (ASC)

Data:

- ◆ 87 students were assigned
 - Middle: 48 (7% of population)
 - High: 38 (5% of population)
- ◆ 75% of students did NOT return to ASC
- ◆ 13 pairs of students were referred for altercations and participated in mediation; NONE had repeat offenses

Highlights:

- ◆ Quiet, distraction, and drama-free working environment for students
- ◆ Open and respectful communication
- ◆ Practices to repair relationships
- ◆ Outreach to community (Staunton police department, MBU)
- ◆ Support of teachers and school

"Our goal is to allow a safe space for students to tell their story, meet students where they are emotionally and academically, to reduce the level of frustration, build and nurture trusting relationships, and return them to their home school in a better place than they were when they came." ~ Kristie Shuey

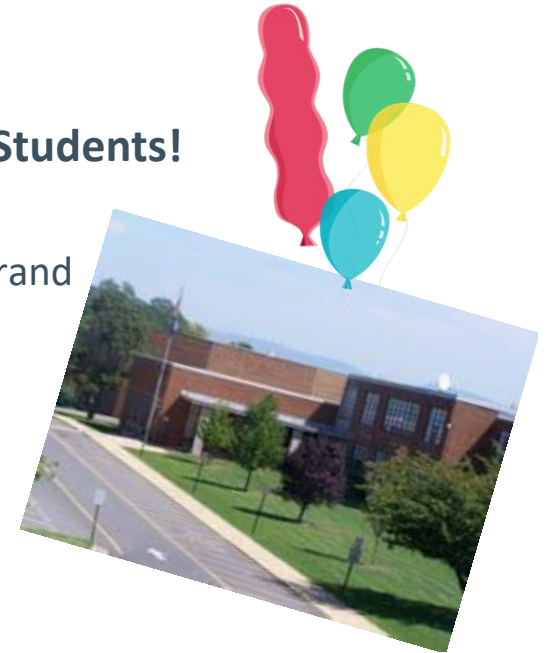

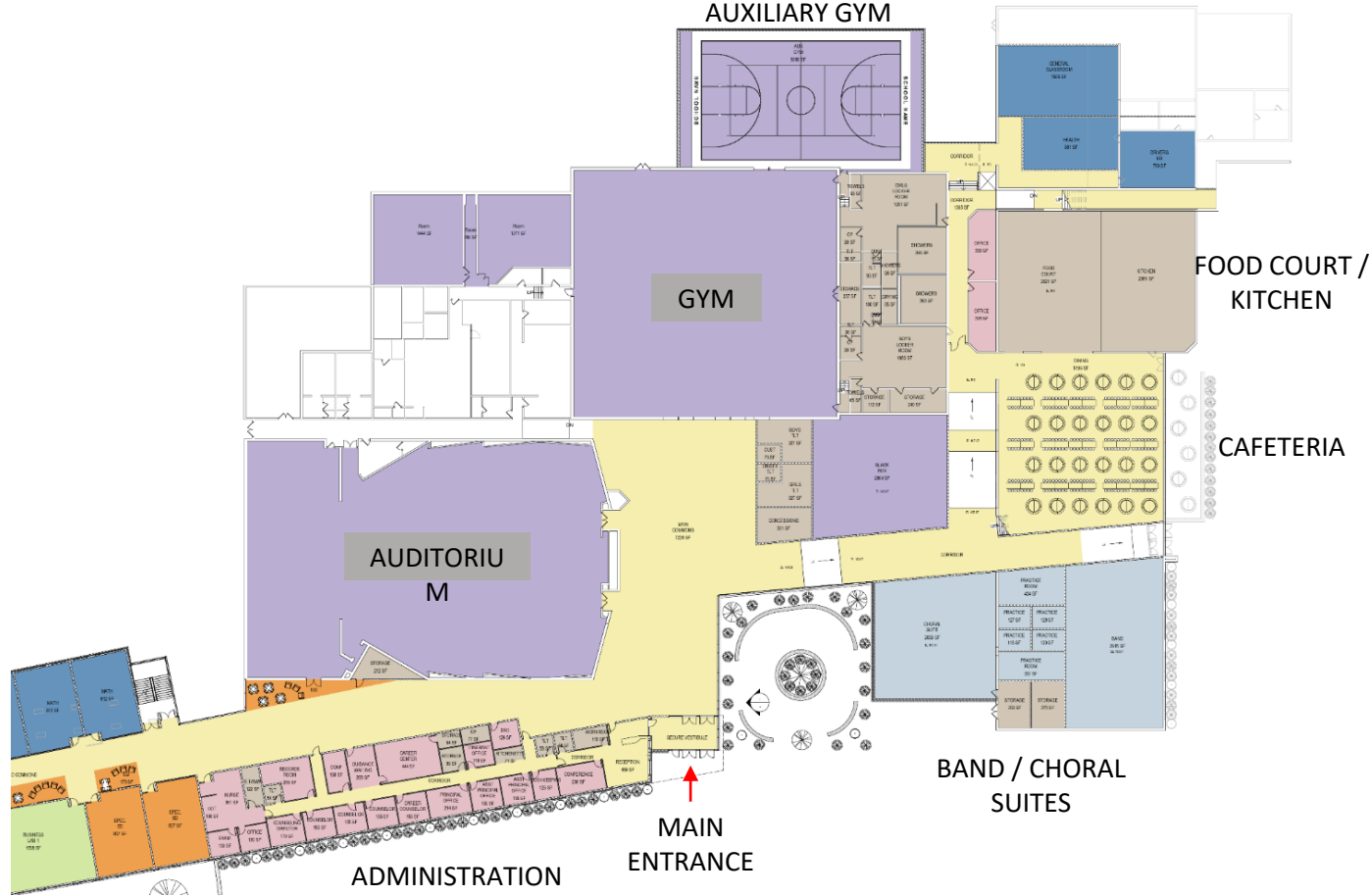
