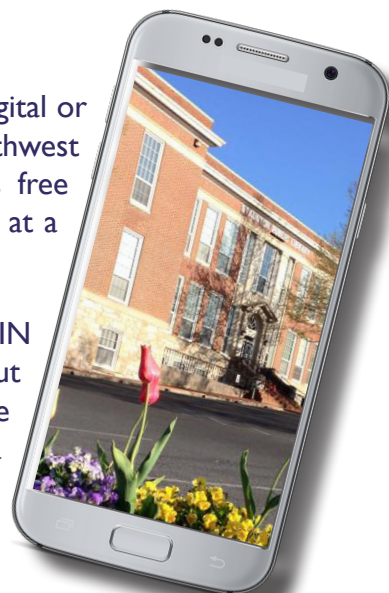

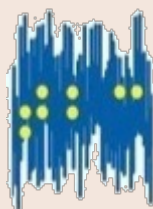
Staunton Public Library Advisory Board

ANIME CLUB 2nd & 4th Wednesdays, 4-5 p.m.

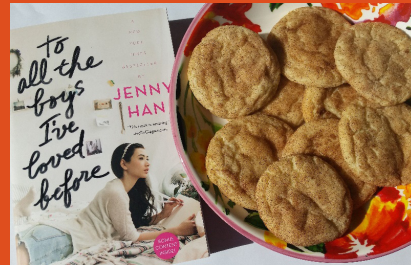
