The Declaration of Independence and the Constitution of the United States [DB52778](#)

The Soul of America by Jon Meacham [DB91082](#) Author presents a survey of American history focusing on points of time in which the politics of fear were at a peak. Time periods include the Civil War, Reconstruction, post-WWII, and the twenty-first century.

The Greatest Generation by Tom Brokaw [DB47490](#) Recalling his coverage of the fortieth anniversary of D-Day in 1984, reporter Brokaw describes World War II veterans as "the greatest generation any society has produced."

Mayflower: A Story of Courage, Community, and War by Nathaniel Philbrick [DB62504](#) Author studies two generations of Pilgrims, from the original 102 passengers who arrived in 1620 to the handful of survivors of the 1675 King Philip's War. Describes the initial storm-tossed voyage, starvation and disease in the wilderness, and the help--and duplicity--of the natives. Some violence.

1776 by David McCullough [DB60330](#) Historian chronicles the struggles of the Continental Army during the disastrous year of 1776. Highlights George Washington's failed New York campaign and the retreat across New Jersey. Assesses the political, economic, and social problems the young nation encountered during the turbulent months from August to December.

Battle Cry of Freedom by James McPherson [DB27449](#) Noted Civil War historian, has written a scholarly history full of anecdotes and human interest from the Civil War period. The discussion centers on the events and issues that divided the American public and led to the war, opposition to the war in both the North and the South, and the reasons for the Union's victory.

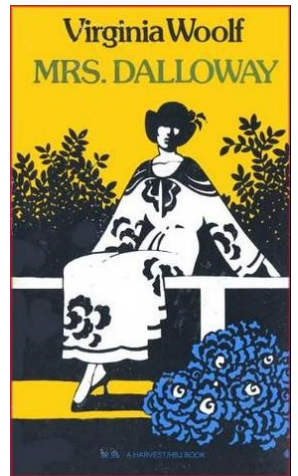
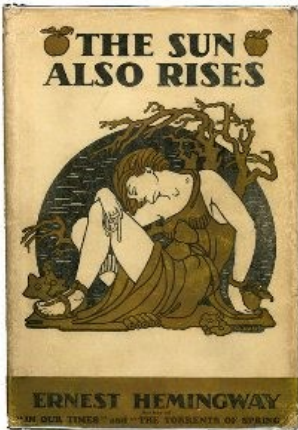
