Administration

State Board of Elections

3 member governing board appointed by the governor

Department of Elections (ELECT)

The Commissioner of Elections is appointed by the governor and employs the personnel required to carry out the duties imposed by the State Board of Elections.

Local Electoral Board

Appointed by the Circuit Court Judge with input from Democratic & Republican Committee Chairs

General Registrar

Appointed by the local Electoral Board
Follows Code of Virginia and ELECT guidelines
Registrar hires her own staff

Voter Registration

The Registrar's Office maintains an accurate list of registered voters for the City of Staunton and administers elections in a fair, efficient, and equitable manner in accordance with the election laws of the U.S. Constitution and the Commonwealth of Virginia.

To be Eligible to Register to Vote in Virginia a Person must:

- ✓ Be a resident of Virginia
- ✓ Be a U.S. Citizen
- ✓ Be 18 years old
- ✓ Not currently declared mentally incompetent by a court of law
- ✓ If convicted of a felony, your right to vote must have been restored

General, Local and Special Elections – Staunton

Turnout Exercise

November 2018 (U.S. Senate and House of Representatives) – 59% **Virginia – 59.5%**

May 2018 (School Board and City Council) – 18%

November 2017 (Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, House of Delegates, Constitutional Officers) – 48% **Virginia – 55%**

May 2016 (School Board and City Council) – 13%

November 2016 (President, U.S. Senate and House of Representatives) – 67% **Virginia – 75%**

November 2015 (Virginia Senate and House of Delegates) – 19% **Virginia – 30%**
