November 25 through January 1, 2020 from 5pm-11pm, Gypsy Hill Park

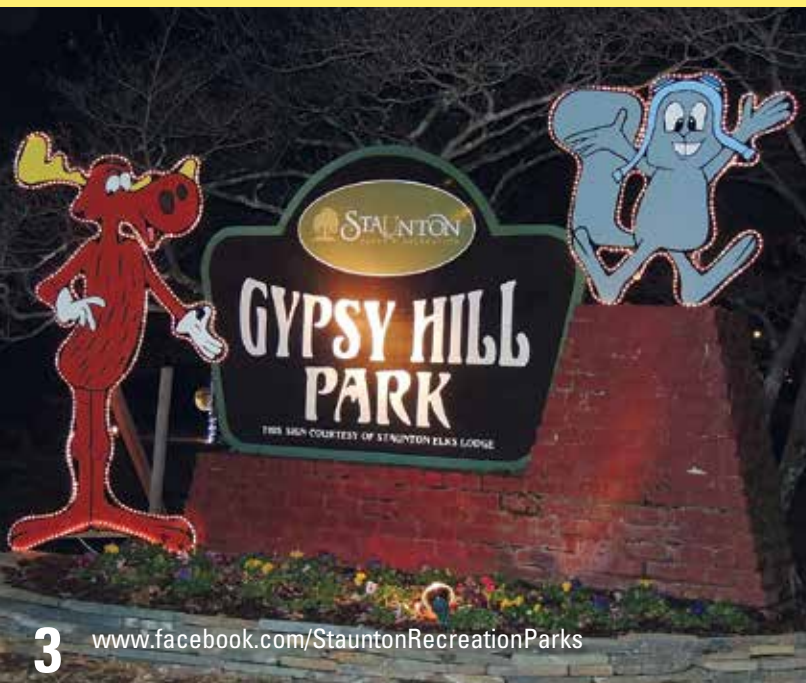

SPRING 2020 ADULT SOFTBALL LEAGUES

Men's Softball Spring League

This league is open to teams consisting of players 16+ years of age to compete in men's slow pitch softball at Montgomery Hall Park in Staunton. Teams can consist of up to 20 players on the roster to be placed in divisions based on ability. The league will begin April 13. Will play Monday & Wednesday nights. Ball requirement is .44 core .375 compression. *League fee is \$350 per team, by April 9.*

Co-ed Spring Softball League

Co-ed league is returning for another exciting year. The league will begin May 5. Ball requirement is 12", .44 core, .375 for men, and any 11", .44 core ball for women. *League fee is \$300 per team by April 27. Men use wooden bats. League will play on Tuesday and Thursday.*

Before/After-school Care

HEART: Healthy Environmental Afterschool Recreation Time

The HEART afterschool program is a latchkey program that provides a home away from home to children of working parents. Concern about safety and being home alone or under-supervised is a good reason to enroll your child in this program. We have little staff turnover from year to year giving us confidence that your child's caregiver is both qualified and trustworthy. We have known many of our child care staff for at least five years and they have extensive training and experience. They understand that parents want their children to be kept safe and feel acceptance and belonging. Most of our staff are parents and grandparents themselves, which can be very reassuring given staff maturity is the common denominator when establishing security and trust in a caregiver relationship. The HEART program has quite a tradition with its roots beginning 30 years ago with the first pilot program at McSwain Elementary School. We have since branched out to each elementary school in Staunton and have developed a credible and professional reputation. Now registering. *Afternoon HEART is \$135 per month. The HEART program is operating as a program exempt from licensure with basic health and safety requirements but has no direct oversight by the Department of Social Services.

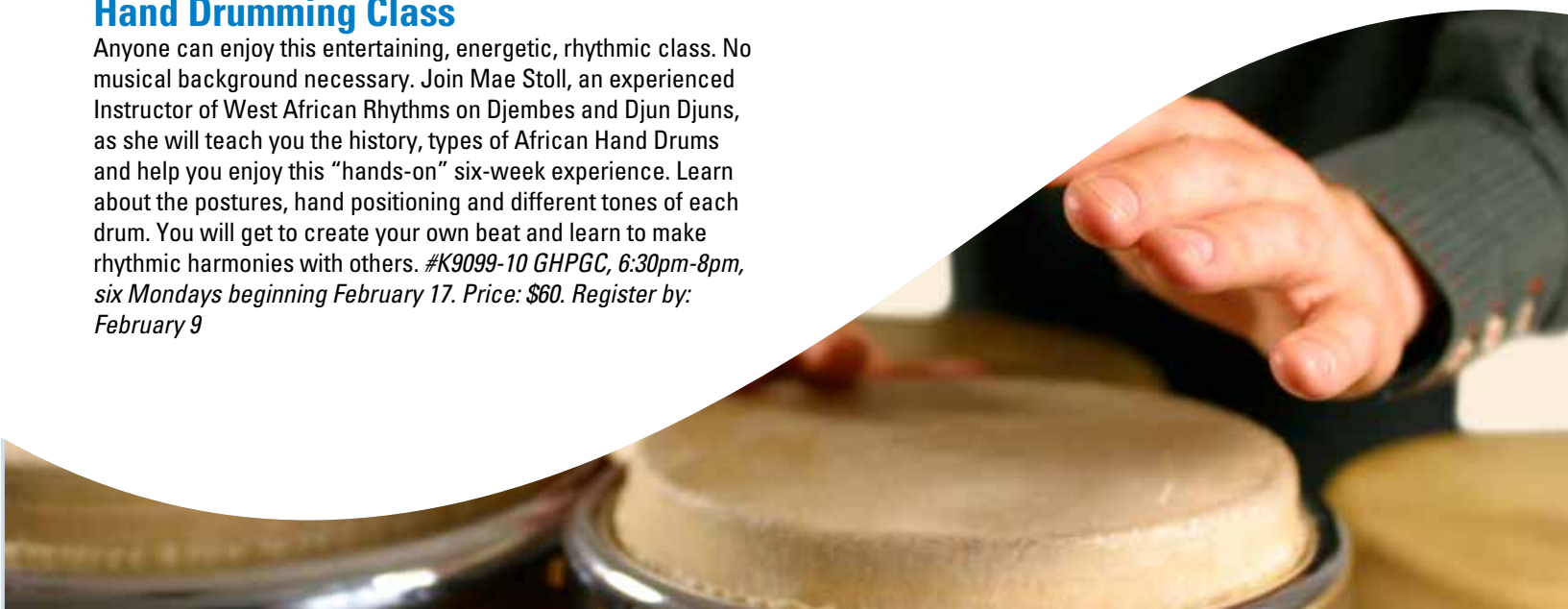
