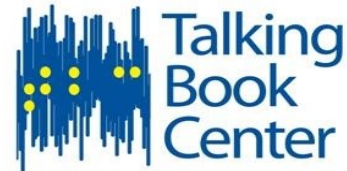

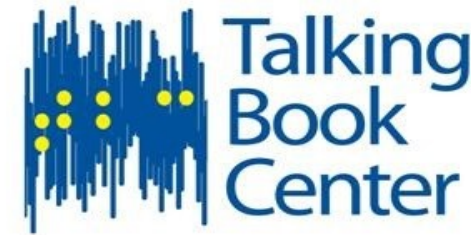

Voting Information:

For the general election of 2020 we will be voting for President & Vice President of the United States, U.S. Senator, and U.S Representative for the 6th District.

There are several ways to vote for the upcoming election!

- ◆ November 3, Election Day– Stand in line and vote in person at your local polls
- ◆ Absentee Voting by mail– Request a ballot from your local registrar. They will mail you a ballot mid-September and you mail it back. Ballots will not be sent to everyone, you need to request it. You can bring your completed ballot to your City Hall or Government Center but you will need a photo I.D., and you can not have someone else bring it for you. You can also mail it in a regular blue post office box.
- ◆ In Person, No Excuse voting– Starting September 18 you can vote in person at your local City Hall or Government Center. This includes curbside voting so you won't have to get out of your car! You will need a photo I.D.

In-person Voting: Mondays through Fridays, most places are closed at lunchtime. You don't need an appointment but you can call ahead if you require assistance

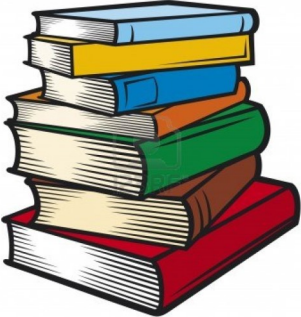
